The meeting was brought to order at 7:00 p.m. by James DeVellis, Chairman. Chairman DeVellis reviewed the agenda. The Board observed a moment of silence for the victims in the recent school shooting in Connecticut.

**Animal Control Officer Recognition**

The Board presented Animal Control Officer Sue Thibedeau with a citation as she was recently named the Massachusetts Animal Control Officer of the Year.

**Citizen's Input**

David Lutkus, who identified himself as a survivor of sexual abuse by William Sheehan, wanted to thank the Board for their recent stand in regards to finding out what happened decades ago when Mr. Sheehan was involved with children in the town.

Mr. DeVellis stated that the Board had an Executive Session earlier this evening in regards to this situation and the Board is trying to be proactive. He encouraged any others affected by Mr. Sheehan to contact Officer Tim O'Leary in the Police Department.

**Chairman's Update**

Mr. DeVellis wished to thank the workers at the recent Town Meeting, especially from the Town Clerk's office and the Advisory Committee.

The Jaycees recently decorated the Common and will be holding Christmas Caroling on December 20<sup>th</sup>.

Upcoming Agenda items include an update from the Asset Review Committee and a discussion of the Town Managers Act.

Mr. Sullivan wished to thank the support of the town, Board of Selectmen, Town Manager and the Police Department in regards to the situation that threatened his family nine months ago.

#### **Change of Manager – Renaissance Hotel at 28 Patriot Place**

The Board met with Scott Williams of the Renaissance Hotel. He is the Assistant General Manager of the Hotel who will be serving as the new Manager of Record. Mr. Williams stated that he has thirteen years of experience in the industry but this will be his first time as a Liquor License Manager. He plans to be on location for 50-60 hours per week and there will be a Food/Beverage Manager on the premises also.

A motion to approve the Change of Manager for the Renaissance Hotel & Spa at 28 Patriot Place to Scott Williams was made by Ms. Walsh and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

#### **Change of Manager – Showcase Cinema at 24 Patriot Place**

The Board met with Joseph Norman of the Showcase Cinema, he will be the new Liquor License Manager. He has twenty-seven years in the industry and has been a General Manager for Showcase for the past ten years.

A motion to approve the Change of Manager for the Showcase Cinema at 24 Patriot Place to Joseph Norman was made by Ms. Walsh and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

#### **Public Hearing – Kenny Chesney Concert at Gillette Stadium**

Ms. Brue read the Public Hearing notice.

The Kraft Organization and Town Counsel have asked that this hearing be continued. The Walpole Board of Selectmen would like to meet with the Board to discuss this application.

Mr. Paicos suggested a meeting on January 15, 2013 to deal with the Gillette Stadium applications.

A motion to continue the Public Hearing for the Kenny Chesney Concert at Gillette Stadium to January 15, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. was made by Ms. Walsh and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

#### **Continued Public Hearing – Taylor Swift Concert at Gillette Stadium**

The Kraft Organization and Town Counsel have asked that this hearing be continued.

A motion to continue the Public Hearing for the Taylor Swift Concert at Gillette Stadium to January 15, 2013 at 7:30 p.m. was made by Ms. Walsh and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

### **Discussion on Saturday Town Meetings**

The Board met with Moderator Frank Spillane to discuss moving Town Meeting to a Saturday. Town Meeting usually starts during the week at 7:30 p.m. and may go until midnight. The seniors in the community have a hard time attending these meetings and requests have been received to move Town Meeting to a Saturday morning so that more seniors could participate. This would affect the Town Bylaws and need a majority vote at Town Meeting. Atty. Spillane, speaking from the Moderator's prospective, suggests putting together a committee to see if this would be feasible.

It was noted that Saturday mornings would be hard for parents with kids in sports or other activities or who go away for the weekend. Whenever Town Meeting is held, there will always be people who can't make it.

The schools work around the Annual Town Meeting in May, moving to Saturday would affect the High School sports schedules. The Town Clerk has said that very few towns hold Saturday Town Meetings, mostly for Special Warrants.

Atty. Spillane suggested a committee comprised of people who have knowledge of Town Meeting, former Board of Selectmen or Advisory Committee members for example.

Ms. Brue feels it would be worth looking at.

Mr. Sullivan feels that a committee would satisfy the people who asked the question.

A Warrant Article could be placed on the next Town Meeting to set up the Committee. They would then report back at a following Town Meeting. The Board would like to see a presentation at Town Meeting by this Committee, not just a yes or no answer.

Mr. Paicos stated that this committee would need guidelines on voting and non-voting members, who appoints the committee, time limits, purpose, etc. Mr. Paicos will draft an article and send it to the Moderator, Advisory Committee and the Board for consideration.

The Board would like to hear from additional townspeople before making a decision.

Resident Ms. Kennedy wanted to know if Town Meeting could be changed to an earlier time during the week. The Bylaw states that Town Meeting is to be held at 7:30 p.m. on the second Monday in May.

Sandra Herrmann stated that the 7:30 p.m. time is to give working people a chance to attend and that all townspeople can't be pleased all the time. Any change could take up to two years to implement.

### **Board of Water and Sewer Commissioners Request for a Special Town Meeting**

The Board met with members of the Water and Sewer Commission who have been

working on a plan for sewers for the town with Mansfield. BWSC member Richard Pacella stated that a Special Town Meeting is required to approve funding for an Intermunicipal Agreement (IMA) with Mansfield. The exact funding is still being worked on and will be presented to the Board of Selectmen and the Advisory Committee soon. The BWSC cannot wait until the May Town Meeting as there are deadlines with Mansfield.

Mr. Paicos stated that the town will not need the whole cost of participation in the IMA but will need debt service that will be bonded over twenty years. The town will be able to sell sewerage to entities in town, but not for the first five years while the plant is being constructed. The financial plan is being developed, the first year the costs will be small as it will be the design phase. The second year will be for permitting and years three through five will be construction. Funding for those years will be interest only. The finance plan will include pre-sale of current available sewerage, the assumption of the reuse tank ad revenue and rate increases. The Water department is an Enterprise Fund which currently has approximately \$280,000 available. The Route 1 billboard funds that are currently in dispute with the Kraft Organization are worth another \$200,000 - \$300,000. Mr. Paicos feels the town has sufficient financial resources to join the district but a decision is required at Town Meeting. Mansfield did not have a quorum at their last Town Meeting in November and will hold another one in February or early March. The district will be comprised of four communities, Foxboro, Mansfield, Norton and Easton. A decision is needed so that the plant can be designed based on how many gallons each community requests. The goal is to sign the IMA agreement by July 1, 2013.

A presentation will be made in January. An engineer from California will be making the presentation.

The Board asked if other articles will be added to the Warrant such as the design fee for the town hall. The Municipal Housing Trust would be added to this Warrant.

The date could be either March 4<sup>th</sup> or March 11<sup>th</sup>. The Advisory Committee would prefer March 4<sup>th</sup>.

A motion to schedule a Special Town Meeting on March 4, 2013 at 7:30 p.m. at the high school was made by Mr. Sullivan and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

### **Renewal of 2013 Licenses**

Mr. Paicos stated that the License renewals have been prepared and are all in order. Mr. Paicos thanked Ms. Herrmann, the Fire, Police and Building Commissioners offices for their hard work in getting all the required inspections done.

A motion to approve all renewals of Licenses for 2013 was made by Mr. Sullivan and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

### **Action Items**

The minutes of November 27, 2012 and December 4, 2012 were reviewed.

A motion to approve the minutes of November 27, 2012 was made by Ms. Walsh and seconded by Mr. Sullivan. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

A motion to approve the minutes of December 4, 2012 was made by Ms. Walsh and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

A donation has been received in the amount of \$200 from Martin Dambekaln of Delafield Wisconsin in memory of Shirley DeLisle to the Library Gift Fund.

A motion to accept the \$200 donation to the Library Gift Fund with gratitude was made by Ms. Walsh and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

Donations in the amount of \$100 from Joanne Pratt and \$400 from the American Legion have been made to the Veteran's Gift Fund.

A motion to accept the donations of \$100 and \$400 to the Veteran's Gift Fund with gratitude was made by Ms. Walsh and seconded by Mr. Sullivan. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

The Orpheum Theater is requesting four One-Day Beer and Wine Licenses for December 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> for their Three Stooges Film Festival and New Year's Eve Comedy Festival.

A motion to grant four One-Day Beer and Wine Licenses for December 26, 2012, December 27, 2012, December 28, 2012 and December 31, 2012 was made by Ms. Walsh and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

A request for a Constable Appointment Renewal has been received from Jerold Loomis. This appointment would expire on December 18, 2015.

A motion to renew the Constable Appointment for Jerold Loomis until December 18, 2015 was made by Mr. Sullivan and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

A request has been received from Demitri's Restaurant at 2 Washington Street to be allowed to open early for the Patriot's game on December 30<sup>th</sup> and to stay open later on New Year's Eve.

A motion to allow Demitri's to open at 11:00 a.m. on December 30, 2012 was made by Mr. Sullivan and seconded by Ms. Walsh. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

A motion to allow Demitri's to stay open one hour later on December 31, 2012/January 1, 2013 until 2:30 a.m. with last call at 1:30 a.m. was made by Mr. Sullivan and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

The Conservation Commission has a Quitclaim Deed for acceptance. Finance Officer Randy Scollins explained that this is for Open Space in a new subdivision on Lawton Lane. The taxes have been paid through the end of December and this deed needs to be accepted by the Board so that no further taxes will be generated.

A motion to accept the Quitclaim Deed for Lawton Lane was made by Ms. Walsh and seconded by Ms. Brue. **The motion carried 5-0-0.**

The Board was informed that there is a policy being worked on in regards to taking land off of the tax roles but that this land was already in the process.

An Executive Session is not needed this evening.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.
