



TOWN CLERK'S REPORT
ANNUAL TOWN MEETING
Monday, the Ninth Day of May, 2011

The Annual Town Meeting of the Town of Foxborough convened at 7:40 PM in the auditorium of the Foxborough Senior High School, 120 South Street, Foxborough, Massachusetts with Town Moderator Francis J. Spillane presiding. Rev. Rebecca Brown, of St. Mark's Episcopal Church, delivered the invocation. John Gray of the Advisory Committee led the Pledge of Allegiance, and Megan Lowey of the Foxborough High School Choir sang the National Anthem. Town Clerk Robert E. Cutler, Jr., read the Warrant and Return.

There were five hundred three (503) registered voters recorded as present [a quorum being one hundred (100) registered voters].

ARTICLE 1: The election of Town Officials was held on Monday, the second day of May 2011. The results of the following positions were announced at the John J. Ahern Middle School by Kathleen M. Brady, Town Warden: one Selectman for three years; one Assessor for three years; one School Committee member for three years; one Water & Sewer Commissioner for three years; one Board of Health member for three years; two Boyden Library Trustees for three years; two Planning Board members for three years; and one Housing Authority member for five years.

ARTICLE 2: Town Clerk, Robert E. Cutler, Jr., presented the 232nd Annual Report of the Town Officers of Foxborough, Massachusetts together with the report of the School Department and Town Accountant/Finance Director for the year ending December 31, 2010.

ARTICLE 3: Moved to hear the report of any committee and act thereon, and to choose any committee that may be wanted, and to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds or borrow pursuant to any applicable statute such sums of money deemed necessary for expenses of any committee chosen under this article.

No reports were given.

ARTICLE 4: MOVED, that section 2(a) Chapter 64 L of the General Laws of the Commonwealth be accepted to impose an excise of .75% on sales of restaurant meals in the town, to take effect on July 1, 2011.

Section 1. Section 4(B)(4) of the Chapter 5 of the Acts of 2004 (the "Act") is amended by inserting after the words "building commission" the words "Department of Health,"; and at the end of such subsection, add the words:

"provided however, that the listing of the Department of Health herein shall not affect the subject matter or policy jurisdiction or authority of the Board of Health of the Town of Foxborough except as to the transfer herein established to the Town Manager of the responsibility of appointment, supervision and removal of Health Department staff including, but not limited to, the Health Agent, Secretary/Environmental Specialist and Sanitariums".

Section 2. Section 4(B)(8) of the Act be amended by deleting the words "health agent".

Section 3. This Act shall take effect upon passage.

Civil Fingerprinting Persons By-law

If requested by the licensing authority, the Police Department may conduct State and Federal Fingerprint Based Criminal History checks for individuals applying for or in possession of¹ the following licenses: Hawking and Peddling or other Door-to-Door Salespeople, Pawn Dealers, and Hackney Drivers.

An applicant, ~~employee or volunteer~~² seeking such a license shall submit, at the request of the licensing authority, fingerprints taken by the Police Department along with a fee to be determined by the Chief of Police.

Upon receipt of the fingerprints and the appropriate fee, the Police Department will transmit the fingerprints to the State Police Identification Unit through the Department of Criminal Justice Information Services (DCJIS), formerly the Criminal History System Board (CHSB). ~~The State Police will compare the subject's fingerprints against its criminal file and then submit the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for a comparison with national records. The results of the FBI check will be returned to the State Police, which will then disseminate the state and national results back to the Police Department.~~³

In rendering a fitness determination, the licensing authority, with the advice of the Police Department shall decide whether the applicant has been convicted of, or is under pending indictment for, a crime, which bears upon his/her ability or fitness to receive the license being applied for, any felony or a misdemeanor, which involved force

or threat of force, controlled substances, or was a sex-related offense. ~~The licensing authority shall condition the issuance of the licensing upon a requirement that all employees, agents and representatives of the licensee submit fingerprints as required pursuant to this Civil Fingerprinting Persons Bylaw.~~⁴

The applicant may request and receive a copy of his/her criminal history record from the Police Department. Should the record subject seek to amend or correct his/her record, he/she must contact CHSB for a state record or the FBI for records from other jurisdictions maintained in its file.

The Police Department shall establish, by rule or regulation, a civilian fingerprinting system for the purpose of conducting state and national criminal history records checks of persons applying for licensures within the Town as required pursuant to this Civil Fingerprinting Persons Bylaw.

The fee charged to the applicant by the Police Department for the purpose of enforcing this section shall be determined by the Chief of Police pursuant to M.G.L. c. 40, Section 22F. A portion of the fee, as specified in Chapter 172B of the Massachusetts General Laws, shall be deposited into the Firearms Fingerprint Identity Verification Trust Fund, and the remainder of the fee may be retained by the Police Department for costs associated with the administration of the fingerprinting system.

The licensing authority is hereby authorized to deny any application for, or to revoke or suspend any license or permit, including renewals and transfers thereof, for any person who the licensing authority reasonably determines is unfit to receive the license, due to information obtained pursuant to this by-law.

This Civil Fingerprinting Persons By-law shall take effect on ~~February 1, 2012.~~ *(New Legislation concerning fingerprinting will be effective May 4, 2012.)*
